History

Introduction

Scope and Content Note

The series in this collection are **ANC Correspondence Series I, Education Committee Series II, Subject Files Series III, Press cuttings Series IV, Press Statements Series V, Photographs Series VI.**

Correspondence Series I (0.39 linear meters) is arranged mainly by the sender, topic, or event around which the correspondence is centered. Where senders and recipients are mixed, the folder is given a general name, such as Faxes, Outgoing. Like other missions, this mission contains a preponderance of evidence of the planning of events; the receipt by the ANC of supportive overtures from dozens of agencies, unions, countries and NGOs; and an increasing support from external forces, the harvesting of which was key to the success of the ANC.

Education Committee Series II (linear meters)

The **Subject Files Series III** (3.60 linear meters) attest to the level of activity the Australian office maintained, both within the country of Australia and in interactions with other nations' movements. The strength of the ANC abroad has been in tactfully garnering support for the movement while maintaining a firm sense of its mission. The organizations, countries and events which this series documents are witness to the extent to which the Australian office committed itself to outreach and involvement as a part of its daily business

Press Cuttings Series IV (linear meters) is a combination of news clippings and runs of important newspapers and magazines interspersed with relevant clippings.

An important front on which the Anti-apartheid battle was fought was the Sports industry, where the threat of cricket boycotts was a steadily debated topic during the prison years. The clippings from Sport give an extensive, thorough focus on this contentious issue.

Press Statements Series V (linear meters)

Photographs Series VI (linear meters) contains an impressive array of 8 x 10 inch photos of all phases of the Anti-Apartheid movement, ranging from early shots of Mandela from his student days, to scenes of violence during the prison years, to the glorious victory over Apartheid and the smiling victors of the ANC leadership. Several conferences, anniversaries and celebrations are documented and catalogued, while other photos contain no description. The researcher may appreciate them for their breadth of scope, for they attest to the dizzying heights and the desperate lows that South Africa has experienced over the last 40 years.
