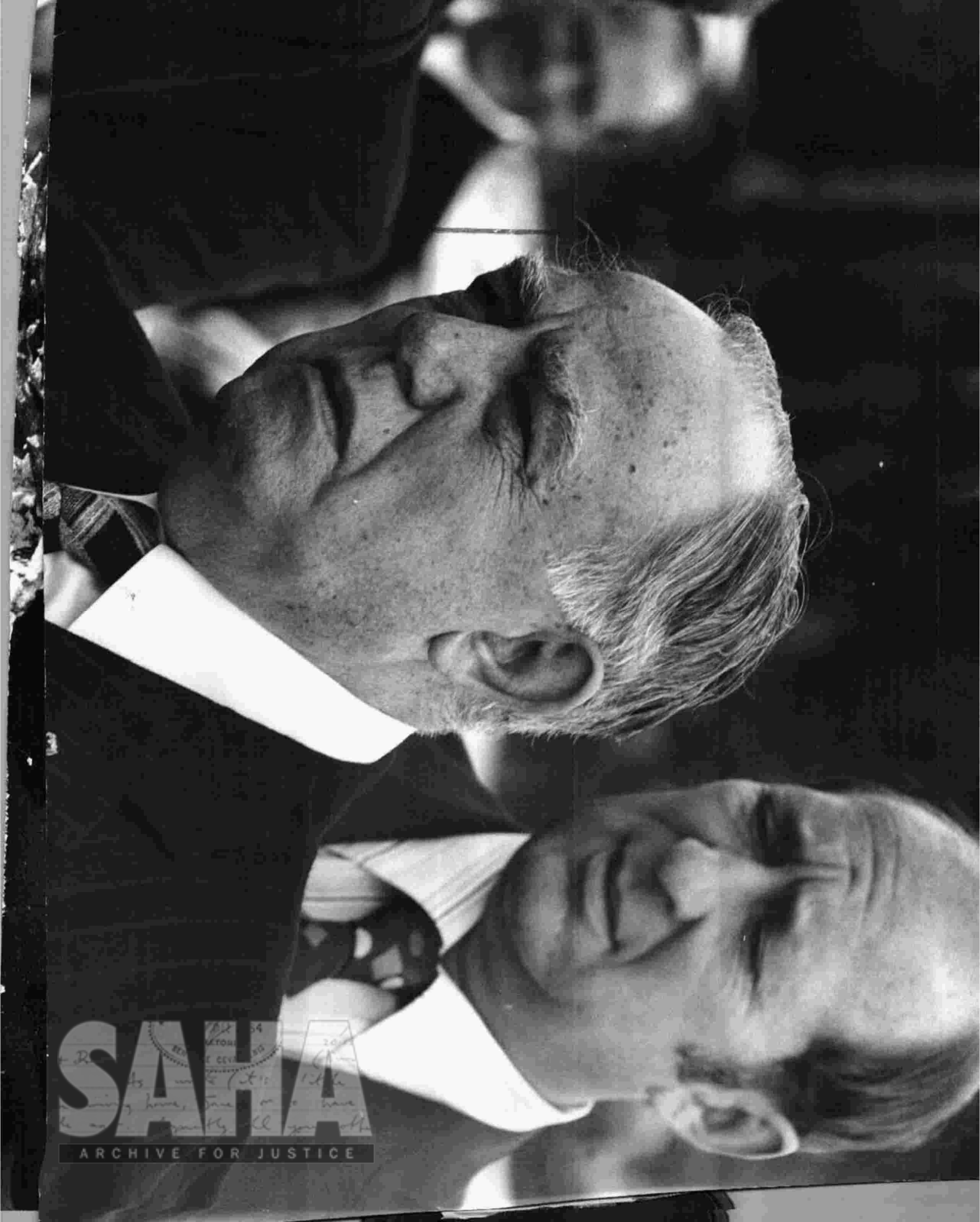

ELECTION MANIFESTO

Dear Voter,

The Republic of South Africa, being a Republic, belongs to its citizens. Those who are elected to manage the affairs of the Republic are, therefore, servants of the community, neither its masters nor its rulers.

You will decide once again on 30 November 1977 who is to represent you as your Member of Parliament for Springs. I was honoured to accept an invitation to stand for election as the National Party candidate for Parliament.

I should, therefore, like to tell you of the main points of principle to which I am devoting myself so that your best interests and those of our country will be served.

1. *To preserve and protect with all my strength the freedom and sovereign independence of South Africa and the rights and liberties of her citizens.*
2. *To serve all sections of the community without fear or favour.*
3. *To promote understanding and better human relationships within South Africa.*
4. *To develop full responsibility for their own affairs, including financial self-support, for all the individual peoples of South Africa.*
5. *To support strict, but fair enforcement of law and order for the safety and stability of South Africa.*
6. *To support a strong Defence Force and to further a high level of internal preparedness, militarily, economically and psychologically.*
7. *To extend friendly and good-neighbourly co-operation on a reciprocal basis to all foreign powers, whenever it would be to South Africa's advantage.*
8. *To help make South Africa's voice heard in the world, to reject unequivocally all outside interference in our affairs and to strengthen our capacity to defeat any pressures, sanctions or other unfriendly acts against the Republic.*
9. *To help make South Africa financially and economically strong by supporting existing policies for careful financial management, protecting the purchasing power of our money and by promoting expanding opportunities for the young people of South Africa.*
10. *To protect salary and wage earners and pensioners by fighting increases in costs and prices.*
11. *To promote equal pay and other rights for women as rapidly as practical.*
12. *To make my first endeavour the needs and interests of Springs, especially the growth of local industry, commerce and employment opportunities and to identify myself fully with the aspirations of our community.*

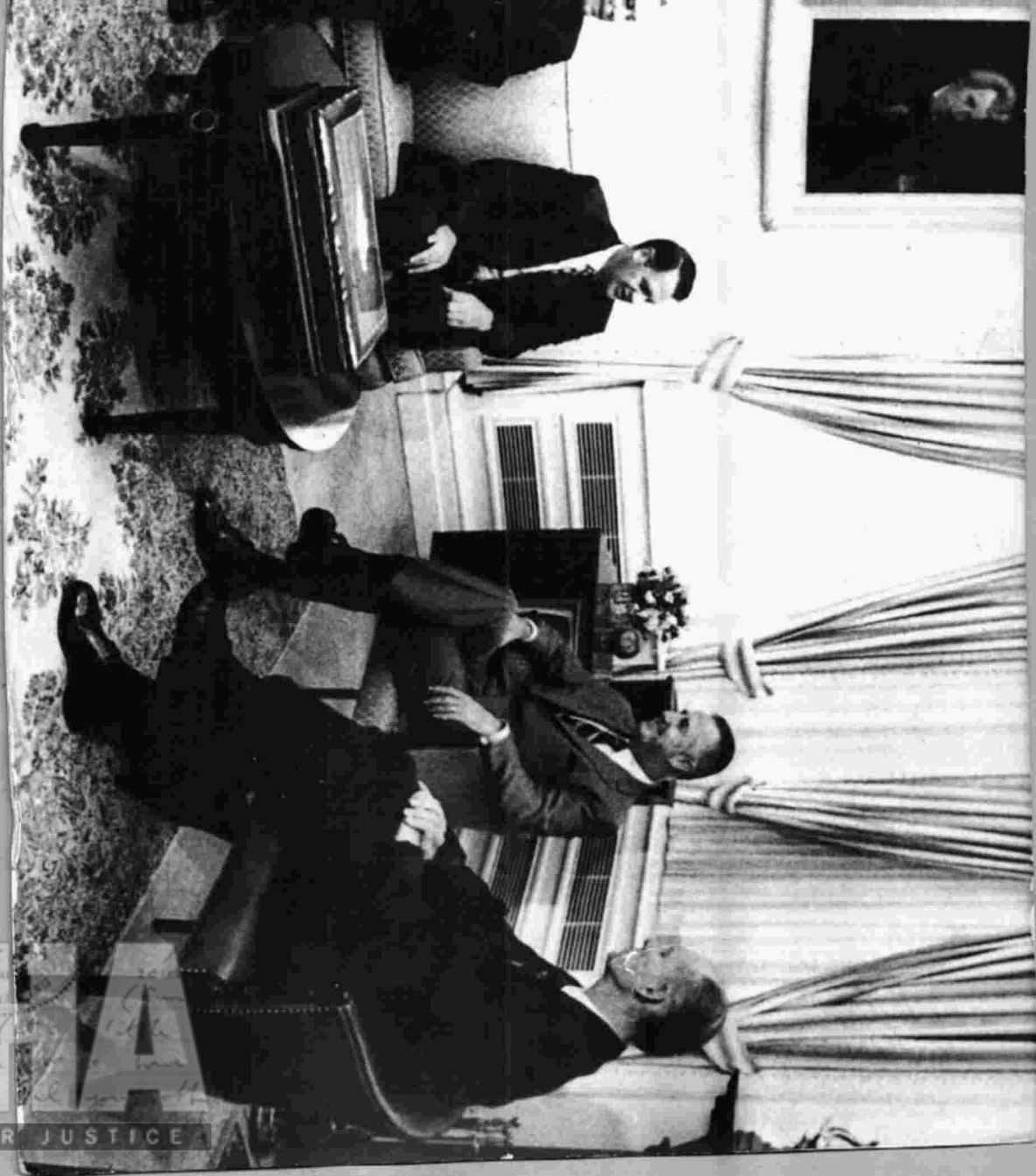

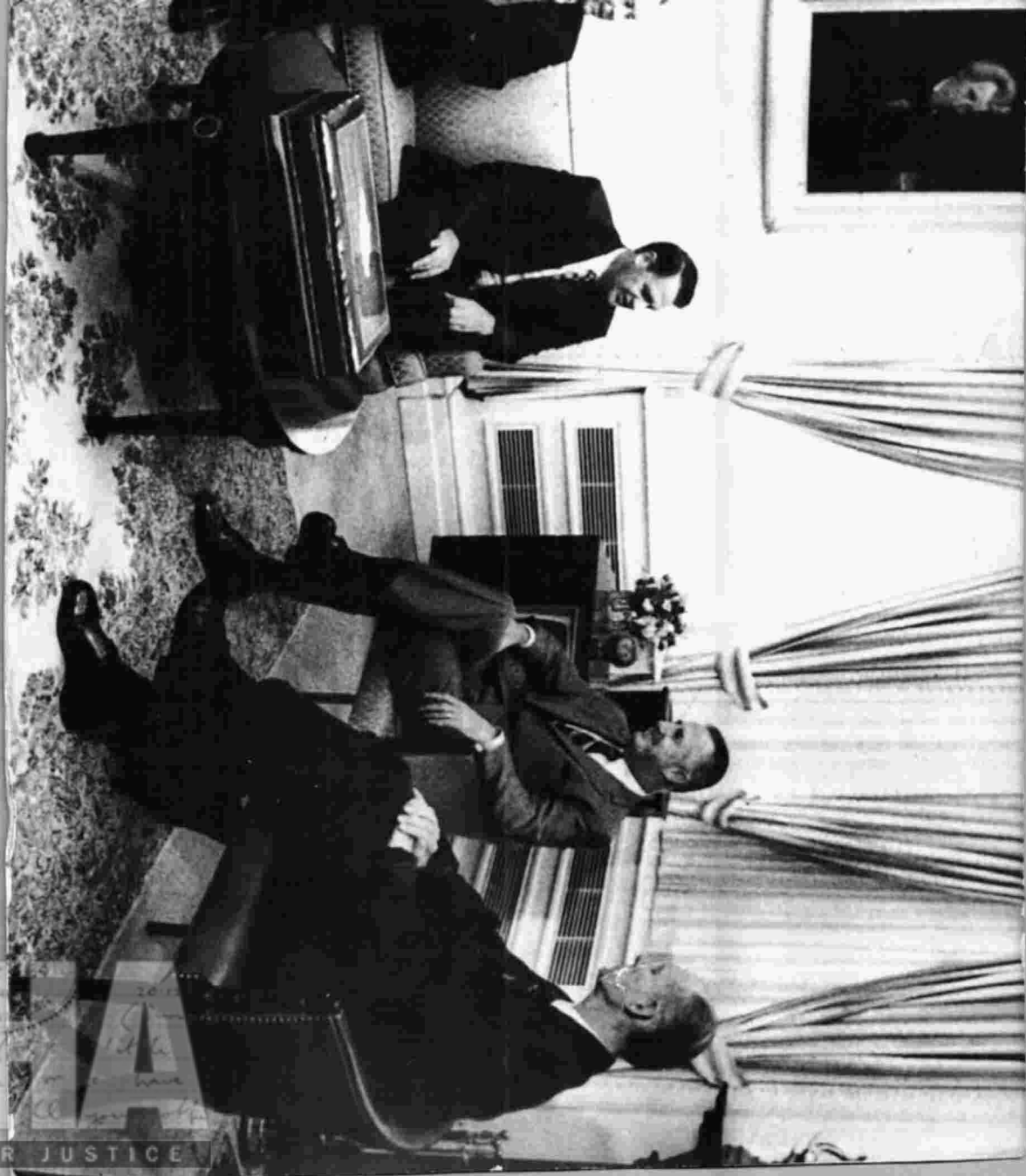
