A SNAKE GVES BIRTH TO A SMAKE

FILM SCREENING THURSDAY 21 APRIL, 17H30 FOR 18H00

This documentary confronts the incredibly complex issues that surround conflict resolution, memory, and healing in communities emerging from genocide and other forms of conflict in South Africa, Northern Ireland, Rwanda, and the Balkans. It is also a story about a South African theatre troupe, the creation of a play, and the power and possibility of art as a way into exploring these issues. As they ignite a dialogue among people with raw memories of atrocity, the actors find they must confront their homeland's violent past and, in turn, their own need for healing.

This screening, co-hosted by the Johannesburg Holocaust & Genocide Centre and the High Commission of Rwanda in Pretoria, will be followed by a discussion. As April is the anniversary month of both the first public hearings of the South African Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) in 1996, and the outbreak of the Rwandan Genocide in 1994, this discussion will consider resonances between the two countries' efforts to overcome the atrocities of the past, as reflected in this film.
