### BETWEEN LIFE AND DEATH: STORIES FROM JOHN VORSTER SQUARE DVD


A virtual walk through the police cells on the 10th floor of South Africa's most notorious police station, where the security force reigned in apartheid South Africa.




### THE BATTLE AGAINST FORGETTING: Human Rights and The Unfinished Business

The issue of justice is vitally important in societies in transition. How do societies where human rights violations were perpetrated in the past move forward to a new future that will allow for reconciliation and transformation?

The booklet is based on a SAHA exhibition, first displayed at Constitution Hill in Johannesburg in December 2010. # MEETING HISTORY FACE-TO-FACE: A GUIDE TO ORAL HISTORY (Book & DVD)



#### SAHA IN THE CLASSROOM


This series of booklets was developed for Grade 12 learners and teachers to support the practical implementation of a source-based study of South African history from 1976 - 1994.

There is a booklet for teachers to accompany each source booklet, with suggested answers to the questions in the related source booklets and advice for educators on how to use the sources in a classroom. The source-based activities are linked to the Learning Outcomes (LO) and Assessment Standards (AS) of the History curriculum. There are tips on how to analyse different kinds of sources, how to deal with issues of bias, reliability and usefulness, are included, as well as how to analyse visual materials such as photographs and cartoons. The educator will then be able to pass these skills on to their learners.


#### ENTERING TEMBISA - BOOK AND CD VERSION OF ONLINE EXHIBITION

In keeping with the South African History Archive's commitment to capturing lost or neglected histories, SAHA worked with three community interns from Tembisa in 2010 and 2011 to conduct oral history interviews with residents about the history of the community.

Images from the 1980s by **Gille de Vlieg**, activist and **Afrapix** photographer, were the departure point. Interviews were conducted, scans of artefacts gathered, an exhibition and oral history competition with two high schools in was hosted by **Tembisa West Library** to mark **Heritage Day** 2011.

#### **KATORUS STORIES**

The stories are a result of the art and memory workshop held by the <u>Khulumani Support Group</u> in **Katorus** on the East Rand, in February and March 2007. The workshop process used art-making to explore **Khulumani** members' memories relating to **repression and violence on the East Rand,** and to record and interpret these memories.




#### South African Resistance Posters of the 1980s

Many of these posters were produced by UDF affiliates, trade unions, and student groups, often as part of various poster-making initiatives, such as the Community Arts Project (CAP) in Cape Town, and the Screen Training Project (STP) in Johannesburg.


### RED ON BLACK:




#### Documents reflecting a changing South Africa

The aim was to reflect on both the dramatic unfolding of contemporary South African history, and the diversity of the struggle for a non-racial, non-sexist and democratic South Africa.
